



Selection Policy for 2019 ITU Paratriathlon World Cup, Tokyo Test Event

OVERVIEW

This Selection Policy (“the Policy”) outlines the process by which the British Triathlon Federation (“BTF”) will determine its individual selections for 2019 PWC, Tokyo.

This Policy has been structured to support BTF’s Paralympic World Class Performance Programme’s (“WCPP”) vision of delivering world class success and inspiring the nation. Specifically, this means that all selection policies for BTF Paralympic international competitions intend to:

- select the right athletes, to the right race, at the right time;
- provide competition opportunities appropriate to an athlete’s stage of development;
- AND
- support the qualification of quota slots for Great Britain at the Paralympic Games.

This event is the focus of the 2019 season for athletes seeking selection to the Paralympic Games. It offers the opportunity to race on the Games course and experience the type of conditions which athletes will be expected to face when racing in the Tokyo Paralympics.

For this event athletes will be considered against the Tokyo Paralympic Games categories only, with the provision for athletes to compete up as per the ITU rules for the sport. Where athletes compete up their performances will be evaluated against the category they are competing up into, although their entry for the event will be into their standard ITU category.

As we move towards the 2020 Paralympic Games in the hot and humid conditions of Tokyo, selection decisions will be influenced by athletes’ demonstration of an ability to compete in hot and humid conditions and of an ability to compete non-wet-suit, where appropriate.

For this event there will be a mandatory preparation camp in Japan which athletes will require to commit to in order to race.

SECTION 1: ELIGIBILITY

To be considered for nomination to the 2019 PWC, Tokyo, athletes must:

- a. Be a member in good standing of a Home Nation Triathlon Association which is a member of the BTF and eligible to represent Great Britain in international championships under the rules of the ITU;
- b. Request nomination for entry into the relevant race via email to paratriathlon@britishtriathlon.org as per the relevant Nomination Deadline outlined in the table below;

- c. Have undergone the required ITU pre-participation examination and submit the BTF fit-to-compete form to paratriathlon@britishtriathlon.org by the relevant Nomination Deadline outlined in the table below; AND
- d. Not be serving a period of ineligibility as a result of an anti-doping rule violation.

SECTION 2: SELECTION PROCESS

- 2.1 Athletes will be selected for nomination to the ITU following the selection meeting on 5th July 2019 and no fewer than 33 days prior to the 2019 PWC, Tokyo.
- 2.2 The Selection Panel (“the Panel”) for the 2019 PWC, Tokyo will convene for the selection meeting and shall comprise:
- a. Voting members;
 - i. BTF Performance Director - Mike Cavendish;
 - ii. BTF Paralympic Head Coach - Jonathon Riall; AND
 - iii. BTF Paralympic Talent Manager - Alasdair Donaldson.
 - b. Non-voting members:
 - i. Note taker(s) if/as required.
- 2.3 BTF is allocated a maximum of 2 quota places per category per gender for the 2019 PWC, Tokyo. Using the process outlined in paragraph 2.5 below, the Panel will select which athletes to nominate to the ITU. If the event is NOT full, all those athletes nominated to the ITU (regardless of the number nominated per country) will be offered a place on the start-list. If the event IS full, the maximum 2 quota places will be observed and athletes will be granted places on the start-list in the order in which they appear on the ITU World Rankings (with no guarantee that all British athletes will be granted a place). In the case that not ALL nominated athletes secure a place on the start lists the process noted in 2.5, below, will dictate which athletes are then confirmed on the start list by BTF. Any subsequent athlete withdrawals will then be replaced by the ITU using a roll down process (based on the World Rankings).
- 2.4 At the Panel’s absolute discretion, they may choose to nominate athletes to the ITU for the 2019 PWC, Tokyo, who have not nominated themselves, in order to secure a place on the start-list for a lower ranked athlete (pursuant to the substitution process outlined at paragraph 3.1 to 3.3 below).
- 2.5 ITU nomination process
- a. Eligible athletes will be **automatically nominated** to the ITU for the 2019 PWC, Tokyo if they satisfy the following:
 - i. 2018 World Championship Gold Medallist
 - a. The Panel will then, **at their discretion**, nominate additional eligible athletes to the ITU who they believe to be **capable of delivering the level of performance required to be competitive** at the 2019 PWC, Tokyo. They will consider the following, in priority order:
 - i. 2018 World Championship Medallists who demonstrate form and fitness in 2019
 - ii. 2019 ITU World Series Medallist demonstrating current form

- iii. Anyone else who does not fulfil the above but who demonstrates an improving WITTW¹ profile, has competed to a high level in domestic paratriathlon's or World Cup races or any other factors the Panel feel demonstrates an ability to be competitive at 2019 PWC, Tokyo.

SECTION 3: SUBSTITUTIONS, INVITATIONS & CONDITIONS

Substitutions

- 3.1 Once the ITU has created the start-list for the 2019 PWC, Tokyo, each National Federation may replace one athlete per category per gender using the ITU substitution procedure.
- 3.2 The Panel will consider substituting athletes out of a race under the following circumstances:
 - a. An athlete who does not wish to compete but is entered, pursuant to paragraph 2.4 above, for the sole purpose of being substituted; OR
 - b. An athlete on the start list is deemed to be performing to a lower performance level than another athlete in the same category who is currently lower on the ITU World rankings and has not secured an automatic start in their own right; OR
 - c. An athlete on the start-list who is unable to compete due to illness or injury
- 3.3
 - a. The Panel will consider substituting athletes into a race should they satisfy the criteria noted in 2.5(b) and they are deemed to be performing at a high enough level to replace the athlete who has secured the position on the start list.
 - b. As only one substitution is allowed per gender (and must be between athletes in the same category) the selection panel will create an order at the time of selection to determine which athletes will have priority for substitution. The substitutions will then be made in line with the ITU policy once initial start lists have been produced.

Invitations

- 3.4 In creating the start-list for a race, if, based on the event entries the ITU determines that race will be full, they will hold back 10 places for potential athlete invitations across all categories and both genders who have not gained a place on the start-list due to a low/non-existent world ranking
- 3.5 At their sole discretion, the Panel will determine whether to request such an invitation but will only do so if they believe that the athlete(s) are capable of delivering the level of performance required to be competitive at the 2019 PWC, Tokyo.

Conditions

- 3.6 Nomination for the 2019 PWC, Tokyo is conditional on the following:
 - a. Athletes must complete any BTF pre-travel medical questionnaire (if required, at the discretion of the CMO, in addition to the ITU fit-to-compete questionnaire). Athletes must also agree (by signing in advance of travel the EIS Data Processing Consent Form) to their personal and medical details being stored on the EIS

Performance Data Management System (PDMS) and shared - where appropriate - with the relevant medical/coaching/management staff. 2019 PWC, Tokyo start positions are limited and ranking points earned are crucial to Great Britain earning quota places at the Paralympic Games. If an athlete is not 100% ready to compete due to injury or illness, they should inform the Head Coach immediately so that a decision may be taken on whether they should be replaced by another British athlete or a whether medical withdrawal is required;

- b. An athlete who elects to withdraw from the 2019 PWC, Tokyo after they have expressed their interest to be considered for nomination, but before the ITU closing date, must inform paratriathlon@britishtriathlon.org immediately so that a replacement athlete may be nominated;
- c. Athletes must be aware of, and compliant with, ITU rules, including those relating to race uniforms, no-shows and late withdrawals;
- d. Withdrawals within 30 days of the ITU closing date may deny other GB athletes an opportunity to compete and could result in BTF losing quota spots for future ITU events. If an athlete withdraws after the closing date set by the ITU, when their reason for withdrawal is not medical or circumstances beyond reasonable control, they will be referred to a BTF disciplinary process. This may result in the athlete being withdrawn from current start-lists and/or not entered in future ITU races for a period to be determined by BTF. Medical withdrawals will need to be endorsed by a BTF Medical Officer as approved by the Performance Director; AND
- e. BTF is given a limited number of 'athlete reprieves' per year. These may be used when an athlete withdraws from the event after 13:00 BST on the Monday prior to the event. This would normally result in the athlete being removed from all ITU events for the next 30 days. The use of this quota will be at the discretion of the Panel, and BTF is under no obligation to allow an athlete to be reinstated even if the full quota has not been used up.

SECTION 4: APPEALS

- 4.1 Athletes may appeal their non-nomination (but not substitution or non-substitution) under this Selection Policy, but only after provision of written confirmation of the relevant decision and only according to the procedure laid out in the "BTF Appeals Policy" which can be found on the BTF website. Athletes wishing to seek advice regarding the appeals process (including the validity of any procedure itself) are advised to contact the British Athletes Commission (BAC) at www.britishathletes.org.

SECTION 5: AMENDMENT

- 5.1 In the event that any unforeseen circumstance makes any provision of this Policy unworkable or ineffective to promote the aims of the Policy, the BTF will be entitled to amend this Policy so that the aims can be secured. Any amended version will be made available at www.britishtriathlon.org.
